### ***159th Church Anniversary Celebration*** ***Sunday, May 5***

On Sunday, May 5, the church will mark its 159th year as a Presbyterian congregation. As we gather to worship we will remember God's grace and providence, express gratitude for those who have preceded us and honor those in our community who are marking significant anniversaries as church members. Through music, liturgy and the celebration of the Lord's Supper we will affirm our oneness in Jesus Christ and the unity of spirit that permeates our life and ministry. We have much for which to be thankful as we seek to serve Christ in the midst of Detroit.

On Mother's Day, May 12, we will observe ***Festival of the Christian Home***. We will not only honor the mothers but also celebrate the important role the nuclear and church families play in forming a deep and enduring faith that begins in childhood and continues through life.

It is interesting to note that at JAPC we have a number of second, third, fourth and fifth generations of families (grandparents, parents, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren) who are members and participate actively in our life and ministry.

The scene is described in the book of Acts, "Suddenly a sound came from Heaven like the rush of a mighty wind... and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:2

JAPC will celebrate the day through music, liturgy and the meditation. In that same spirit, members and friends are encouraged to wear red to symbolize the "tongues of fire" and the Christian Church's birthday. As the disciples were made bold and the Good News was proclaimed on ***Pentecost***, may we by our presence in worship let others know this same Spirit is alive today at JAPC.

Thank you for the vote of confidence and faith in this ministry. I am committed to building "The Circle of Light Theatre" and bringing professional level performances that will invigorate and inspire. In order to accomplish our vision we need the participation of members from our community who are willing to step up and be a part of our core team. All are welcome and needed!!! So consider yourself called.

In the next few weeks you will see announcements for classes and seminars that will help us kick off our ministry. These classes and seminars will be informational and participatory. They will offer those interested the basic tools necessary to being an actor, director, stage manager and craftsperson. Classes being offered will discuss the process of how we can become truthful actors and craftspeople. Below you will find a short three act description of what we are planning for the next weeks, months, and year. We will soon have a link up on the JAPC web site dedicated to our

**Act I:** Form a core group of members, community members, and theater professionals who are dedicated and willing to participate in the building of a theatre troupe that will perform short vignettes to enhance Sunday service, assist in creating and implementing lesson plans using theater and performances with our youth program, teach acting and theater classes for the community, JAPC members, and other churches, seek financial support through grants, special gifts, and benefactors.

**Act II:** Produce original showcase events related to relevant topic and issues confronting our community and church using the principles of our vision and faith as key ingredients of the production. Create and produce youth talent events that would include the community, other local churches and the local Presbyterian churches. Form an Improvisational Troupe that will be able to use the principles of our faith as tools within the performance to confront any topic or issue presented. Form the core team of directors, actors, technicians, and assistants for two major productions in 2013–2014 Fall/Winter.

**Act III:** Select the two plays to be performed in the winter of 2013 and 2014. Begin production and rehearsals. Continue other performances; hold a youth event showcasing the talent of the youth in our community and church. Obtain benefactors and financial support. Finalize policies and procedures for the ministry.

### *Youth Mission Deadline Approaching Deadline Sunday, May 5*

The youth of JAPC (current 5th through 12th grade students) have the opportunity to serve God this summer at the Sandusky Mission Center at the First Presbyterian Church of Sandusky, Ohio June 17 – 20. Exact details about where we will be serving will be available closer to our departure, but we will have opportunities for relational ministry as well as light handiwork. During our trip, we will stay at FPC Sandusky and prepare our own meals. Our plan is to serve in the community Monday afternoon and all day Tuesday and Wednesday. On Thursday we will spend the day at Cedar

Pointe before heading home.

The cost for the trip is \$125 which includes transportation, program fees, room/board and entrance to Cedar Pointe. However, students will need to bring additional money for lunch and dinner on Thursday. Confidential scholarships are available for the entire cost of the trip by contacting Katy. To reserve, your spot please submit a check for the full amount of the trip payable to Jefferson Avenue Presbyterian Church. The deadline to sign-up is Sunday, May 5.

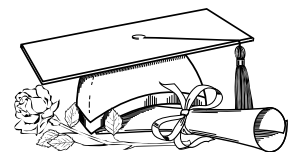
### Kroger Community Rewards Please Enroll/Re-enroll

### *Community Chorus of Detroit Sings Out Again at JAPC*

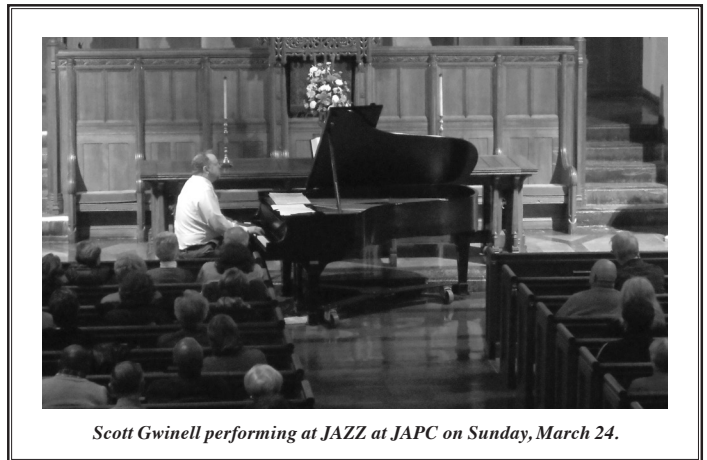
In May, the Community Chorus of Detroit, which calls our church home, will be performing two concerts called *Detroit: A Metamorphosis*. They are on Friday, May 17 at 7:30 and Saturday, May 18 at 4:00. Advance-purchase tickets are \$16 or \$14 for groups of 10+. Tickets at the door are \$20. The following is the chorus' description of the concert:

#### *Detroit: A Metamorphosis A Place of Hope for All People*

In light of so much recent tragedy and violence in our country and city, the spring concert program is a creatively configured musical statement. Because all acts of tragedy and injustice echo in the minds and hearts of Metro Detroiters today, the program lifts up a representative sampling of universal experiences for reflection. Starting with musical movements from the Mozart *Requiem*, the Gorecki *Symphony #3*, and the Rutter *Requiem*, as well as moving readings by Metro Detroit residents, the program moves powerfully, both musically and topically, toward a new vision for the future, to Louis Armstrong's *What a Wonderful World* — a wish of universal hope, prayer, love, peace, and gratitude for our earthly home and for all people — to create a new world and a new Detroit. "This will be our reply to violence: to make music more intensely, more beautifully, more devotedly than ever before." — Leonard Bernstein"
